MYTH: There are only the driver of the truck and a couple of guys who help cut the grass in a landscape company.

TRUTH: The Green Industry has a wide range of job opportunities. A landscape company can have production team members to a CEO, and all the jobs in between. Production, design,



administration, financial, human resources, and marketing are just a few departments that are in a professional landscape company.

MYTH: Landscapers can use their old mowers and blowers to cut grass.

TRUTH: Professional Landscapers take pride in their work and need the right tools to get the job done. Rotating equipment every few years and keeping current equipment in peak performance is important to the quality of work performed.



MYTH: Landscapers wear old worn out clothes because let's face it, they will get dirty.

TRUTH: A good uniform program (from boots to hats) in a landscape company is a sign of a professional landscape company.

MYTH: Landscapers don't need insurance; the property owner will have general liability insurance in case of an accident.

TRUTH: Professional landscape companies carry ample Worker's Comp and General Liability insurance. They do not lean on the property owner to cover them.

MYTH: You never know who is going to show up to cut your grass. .

TRUTH: A professional landscape company will have processes in place that give their clients a sense of peace about who is on their property working.

MYTH: The weather is bad, therefore your landscaper will not show up and will not call to let you know.

TRUTH: A professional landscape company will have weekly schedules regarding turf maintenance and will watch the radar to help reroute crews during inclement weather. Clients are informed when changes in their schedule happen, and a scheduled visit is always rescheduled.



Are You Comparing Apples to Apples?

In the landscape business we may hear, "We went with another bid because their price was cheaper." As a landscape professional, we'd like to ask a followup question: "Are you comparing APPLES TO APPLES?"

If this is the case for you and you find that another bid is lower, *make sure* that the services on the higher quote are the SAME as the services on the lesser quote. Any person responsible for making the decision should



always compare each service and what is involved with each service. Then you can make a logical and informed decision on which landscape company to hire. Does the cheaper quote just have turf mowing whereas the more expensive quote has turf mowing, edging, weedeating, blowing of all hard surfaces? If the services in quotes are drastically different, there will be a big difference in price.

What should you look for in a quote from a landscape company? A landscape maintenance quote and/or a landscape design quote should always be a detailed quote with measurements for beds, turf, etc for the exact services that will be delivered to the property. If the company cannot give a detailed account for their exact services, then this is a sign that either this company doesn't have a thorough maintenance/design plan and/or this company does not know their cost for services. As a property owner, if a landscape quote has services that the other quotes are not giving prices for, ask that the quote(s) be adjusted so that **you can compare APPLES TO APPLES.**

Always look deep into any quote and understand what services are being quoted so you as a consumer can make an accurate choice that is not solely based on price **BECAUSE CHEAPER IS NOT ALWAYS BETTER**.
